Focus Groups on Air Travel

Oregon Health and Science University is looking for people in the Phoenix area, with disabilities, who travel between cities by air. We are having focus groups on April 25th (1:00 PM) and April 26th (10:00 AM) at the SILC Central Office in Phoenix (2400 N. Central, Suite 105) to talk with you about your experiences and thoughts. We will use the information from these focus groups to create training materials for air, train, and inter-city bus employees that assist people with disabilities in traveling on planes, trains, and buses. We will also use this information to create materials to assist people with disabilities with the travel process.

Oregon Health and Science University is looking for people in the Phoenix area, with disabilities who HAVE NOT traveled between states by air, within the last three years. We are having focus groups on April 25th (10:00 AM) and April 26th (1:00 PM) at the SILC Central Office in Phoenix (2400 N. Dissertation Recruitment

Susan Stuntzner, PhD Candidate at University of Wisconsin - Madison in Rehabilitation Psychology is conducting a study of people with SCI and is recruiting 20-30 people. She is presently working on her dissertation entitled, "An On-Line, Self-Study Forgiveness Intervention: A Comparable Intervention in Decreasing Negative Emotions and Increasing Quality of Life in People with Spinal Cord Injury."

This study is an experimental design. Participants will be randomly assigned to one of two interventions and participants will be able to complete the interventions at their given geographical locations. In short, selected participants will be asked to complete some initial assessments, participate in an 8-week intervention followed up by a series of post-tests. The study will primarily require approximately 3 months to complete, excluding a 2 month follow-up assessment. Total time required of participants will be 5 months due to the 2 month follow-up assessment.

Participants eligibility requirements are:

- (a) Have lived with a spinal cord injury for at least one year
- (b) Are between the ages of 18 and 55;
- (c) Might feel that your injury was "unfair" or "unjust" regardless of the cause or attributing factor;
- (d) Would be interested in working on forgiveness;

Advanced Wheelchair Skills Clinic

Shorter hospital and rehabilitation stays may not allow enough time to learn important wheelchair skills, as we age we may need to brush-up or learn new skills to remain independent. This lack of wheelchair skill may lead to secondary conditions or isolation because we cannot negotiate the environment. This course will allow you to become more efficient in the use of your wheelchair. Come and join us in some practical advice from those in the know.

April 4th – Transferring: Char to furniture/bed/vehicle; chair to floor/floor to chair.

April 11th – Managing Your Environment: Opening and closing doors; operating elevators and escalators; wheelies; curbs; managing stairs; ramps and various terrain, etc.

April 18th – Mechanics of Your Chair: Adjustments and maintenance of your wheelchair

April 25th – Bathroom Mobility – Focus will be on transfers and clothing management in the restroom.
