Arizona's 11th Annual Transition Conference

Arizona's Eleventh Annual Transition Conference, Imagine It, Plan It, Do It! is a collaborative, cross-stakeholder professional development event aimed at providing meaningful and pertinent information needed in the transition planning process for youth and young adults with disabilities. This year's conference includes a dynamic array of national speakers, state level experts, and also includes youth, young adult, and family member participation. Sessions contain content from the following strands: Community Partnerships, Family Voice, Secure Care, Career and Job Development, Accessing Community Resources/Medical and Social Empowerment, Youth and Young Adult Empowerment, Assistive Technology, and Curriculum and Instruction.

Early registration for Arizona's Eleventh Annual Transition Conference is now open and will end Friday, June 17, 2011. Standard registration begins Saturday, June 18, 2011, and ends Friday, September 9, 2011. This conference has been filled to capacity for the last two years, make sure to register early!

Please note the following registration details:

- Conference registration will be processed exclusively online for all participants;
- Early, standard, and late/walk-in registration periods significantly impact registration fees;
- Family and youth/young adult-focused strands will only be held on Monday and Tuesday. Registration fees and scholarship funding allow participants who register as a family member, youth, or young adult to attend the conference on October 3 and 4, 2011. Additional information about scholarships will be disseminated in June;
- Registration fees for educators, service agency providers, and other professionals allow participation in all three days of the conference;
- Scholarships continue to be available on a first-come, first-served basis for youth, young adults, and family members needing assistance with lodging or registration costs. Only youth/young adults aged 22 and younger and/or family members of eligible youth are eligible for scholarship funding; and
- There will be no allowance for single-day registration.

SPECIAL NOTES: The conference begins at 9:30 a.m. on Monday morning to accommodate participants traveling from out of town. Also, in order to be environmentally conscious, paper copies of handouts will not be provided at the conference. Materials for all sessions will be posted online three weeks prior to the conference on the ADE/ESS Secondary Transition website; participants are asked to print and bring materials for sessions of interest.

TAXI PROGRAM FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES DEBUTS

Phoenix Public Transit adds ADA taxi coupon to current subsidy programs

Phoenix — The Phoenix Public Transit Department has launched a new taxi coupon program for Phoenix residents with disabilities. Called ADA Cab, the program supplements Phoenix's heavily-used Dial-a-Ride program for people who are certified in accordance with the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA). By working with local taxicab companies, the program allows participants to book trips at a subsidized rate, allowing for lower costs and more flexibility.

"The ADA Cab program bolsters our transit offerings for people with disabilities, and allows passengers to book their own travel when it is convenient for them," said Phoenix Public Transit Department Director Debbie Cotton. To purchase coupons at a discount, participants must be Phoenix residents under the age of 65, and they must be ADA-certified. Certified participants can buy coupons to use to pay for cab trips. Each coupon is worth a dollar, and the \$20-coupon books sell at 30 percent of their value, or \$6 apiece. Participants can buy a maximum of \$40 at that discount, and they can purchase an additional \$40 at half price; in total, users can buy up to \$80 worth of taxi vouchers monthly for \$32. The coupons can be used for an entire trip, and can be combined with cash fares to travel further.

ADA Cab is one of several alternatives to fixed-route bus service that Phoenix Public Transit offers for people with disabilities. These options include Dial-a-Ride, which provides scheduled trips; the Senior Cab coupon program for Phoenix residents age 65 and over, as well as dialysis and work trip voucher programs. The ADA Cab program is funded by the City of Phoenix and New Freedom grants from the Federal Transit Administration. The Phoenix City Council requested development of the alternative taxi program after same-day Dial-a-Ride services were eliminated from the department's budget.

Independent Living Rehabilitation Services

The Independent Living Rehabilitation Services (ILRS) program is a federally funded program through Title VII, Chapter I, Part B of the Rehabilitation Act.

Through this legislation, states are mandated to maximize leadership, empowerment, independence and productivity of individuals with disabilities by promoting a philosophy of independent living. This includes consumer control, peer support, self-help, self-determination, equal access and individual and systems advocacy.

The ILRS program is focused on providing four core services:

- Independent Living Skills training
- Information and referral to appropriate agencies or providers
- Individual and systems advocacy
- Peer support and counseling and/or mentoring

To be eligible, you must be a person with a significant physical, mental, cognitive or sensory impairment which substantially limits your ability to function independently within your family, your home and your community. There must be a reasonable expectation that ILRS will assist you to improve your ability to function, continue functioning or move towards functioning independently.

Call the District office that you reside in and staff will put you in touch with an Independent Living counselor for the Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA) in your area.

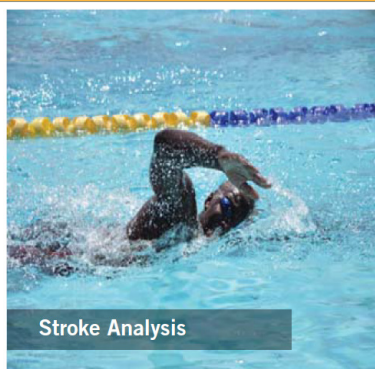

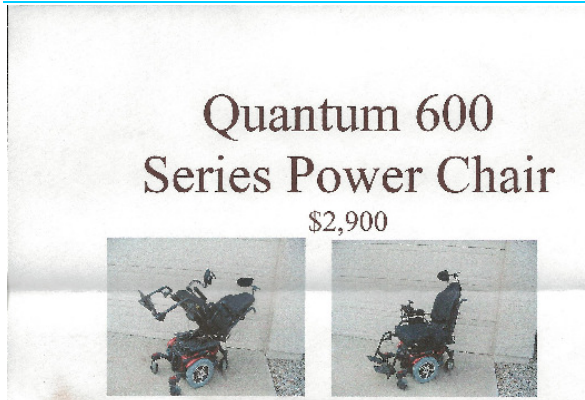
